

Local Control & Accountability Plan

LCFF—Local Control Funding Formula

- Increases school funding and directs more resources to CA's highest-need students.
- Requires charter schools to develop Local Control and Accountability Plans (LCAPs) .
- Establishes annual goals for all students.
- Describes what actions will be taken to achieve the goals.
- Details how funds will be spent to increase or improve services.

Advisory Groups: Parents and Community

Parent and community engagement is essential to the process of creating goals and objectives to meet the needs of the diverse population the school serves. It is essential to engage the parents of students that are eligible for free or reduced-price meals, English learners, or foster youth. Engagement will happen through a variety of forums and groups including School Advisory Council, English Learner Advisory Committee, and informational workshops.

STATE PRIORITIES

Districts must set annual goals based on 8 State Priority areas

2. **Implementation of Common Core State Standards**
3. **Parental Involvement**
4. **Student Achievement** *Statewide assessments, API, EL reclassification rate, college preparedness, etc.*
5. **Student Engagement** *Attendance rates, dropout rates, graduation rates, etc.*
6. **School Climate** *Suspension and expulsion rates, etc.*
7. **Access to Courses**
8. **Other student outcomes in subject areas**
